AUGUST 26 - WOMEN'S EQUALITY DAY

At the behest of Rep. Bella Abzug (D-NY), in 1971 the U.S. Congress designated **August 26** as "**Women's Equality Day**." The date was selected to commemorate the 1920 passage of the 19th Amendment to the Constitution, granting women the right to vote. This was the culmination of a massive, peaceful civil rights movement by women that had its **formal beginnings in 1848 at the world's first women's rights convention, in Seneca Falls, NY.**

ERA - EQUAL RIGHTS AMENDMENT

Equality of rights under the law shall not be denied or abridged by the United States or by any state on account of sex.

The Congress shall have the power to enforce, by appropriate legislation, the provisions of this article. This amendment shall take effect two years after the date of ratification. The ERA was ratified by 35 states; only 3 states short of the requirement for passage.

UNCEDAW

United Nations Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination Against Women (CEDAW) adopted in 1979 by the UN General Assembly. It provides the basis for realizing equality between women and men through ensuring women's equal access to, and equal opportunities in, political and public life -- including the right to vote and to stand for election -- as well as education, health and employment. **CEDAW has been ratified by 190 countries.** The US Congress has not.


